## GSCA Community Project on October 3

The Greater Salem Contractors Association is teaming up with the Town of Salem to create a "Train Staton" at the Rail Trail Pumping Station. A 4'x38' platform that will mimick the official train station landing at the old Canobie Lake Railroad Station is being built where the Salem and Windham Rail Trails meet.



The original Canobie Lake Station was built in 1885, replacing the small Policy Pond Station at the request of local businesses and residents in Salem and Windham who wanted a better station for passengers and freight. The New Hampshire Railroad Commissioners wanted a dignfied name for the area, so in honor of the residents' Scottish heritage, the Railroad Commissioners named the station after Cannonbie, Scotland. Reflecting the power and influence the railroads had on society at the time, Policy Pond was renamed Canobie Lake and Canobie Lake station opened on November 9th, 1885.

On October 3, 2020, the Greater Salem Contractors Association will be donating labor and the Town of Salem is coordinating donation of materials for the landing. A mocked up railroad with hand cart along with the landing will make a great landmark for visitors of the Rail Trail.







#### **ACROSS**

- 2 Round metal pipes installed for distributing warm air from the furnace to rooms in the home.
- 7 Amounts withheld from progress billings until final and satisfactory project completion.
- 8 Row of shingles or roll roofing running the length of the roof.
- 9 Wet mixture of cement, sand and water that flows into masonry or ceramic crevices to seal the cracks.
- 11 Coating applied prior to the finishing or top coats of a paint job.
- 12 Common word for concrete floors, driveways, basements and sidewalks
- 14 Cutting and fitting woodwork to an irregular surface.
- 16 Heating contractor.
- 17 4 mil or 6 mil plastic sheeting.
- 20 Thin flat piece of wood, plywood or similar material framed by stiles and rails as in a door.
- 21 Area below eaves and overhangs.
- 23 Encumbrance that usually makes real or personal property the security for payment of a debt or discharge of an obligation.



- 1 Loan secured by land.
- 3 Wood trim molding installed around a door or window opening.
- 4 Location between the touching surfaces of two member or components joined and held together by nails, glue, cement, mortar or other means.
- 5 Tax levied on a property, or a value placed on the worth of a property.
